Course Report

Capital Improvements


This winter and early spring have been busy. We've done tree removal and clean-up on the course and **burning** of brush piles and creek beds will be taking place. Projects recently completed and some still on the list through April include:

• The concrete **turnaround corner on #10** is gone. Staff will be sodding for appearance and play of the hole.

Final touches to the **irrigation system** will take place in

April.

• Fairways, tees, and roughs will be fertilized in April with 40-0-0, aceleprn and dimension for grubs and broadleaf weeds. We are still working on healthy root growth and thickening the canopy of our grasses.



- Aerating and top dressing the greens begins the
 first week of April to promote health, firmness, and
 reduce the use of fungicides. We'll also be using a
 Verticutter, with special vertically oriented blades
 that are capable of cutting into the thatch on the
 greens without damaging any healthy blades of
 grass.
- After the first mow and aerating, tee markers and ball washers will go back on the course. Beginning April 14, we will begin a regular mowing schedule, and an intensely monitored irrigation schedule.
- Bunkers on the back 9 will be an ongoing project.
 The second fairway bunker on #14 and the first
 fairway bunker on #18 will become grass bunkers
 very soon.
- The 5-year plan will be out in April including projected future equipment expenses, yearly maintenance goals, and anticipated major projects.







Bridge Work

Work continues just west of the club entrance. Thanks to Mike Adams there are some great directional signs at major intersections of the detour. It's easy folks! Rumor has it that work will be completed in early May. Fingers crossed! If you need a map, contact the clubhouse.
